One of the battle area regarding the Mikatahara Battle between Takeda Shingen and Tokugawa Ievasu.




5Gosha Shrine

Air raid and naval ganfire in World war 2nd burned Hamamatsu to the ground. The museum preserves and displays records of the reconstruction and pictures of people back then.




Hamamatsu, Kinoshita Keisuke is widely acknowledged as one of the movie directors who established the golden era of Japanese movies.


When losing a battle and running away. Ievasu hid in hole of canfer tree, and cloud rose to help him to hide from enemy..

This shine dedicated to the memory of Tevasu. Hideyoshi & Ieyasu visited here. Together, two persons came to the power later. So. it is called as "Power Spot".



When Hidetada (second general of Tokugawa family) was born, this well was used for baby's first bath.



The observation deck on the 45th floor of the Act. Tower stands 185 meters above the ground and offers one of the best views in this district. Mt.Fuji can be seen on clear day.
