② Air Park

In the hall with the theme of "See, Touch and Experience", visitors can enjoy the F-1 supporting fighting planes, flight simulator, adomed ther-ter, and more.

③ Takayanagi Memorial Hall

The history of Kenjiro Takayanagi, called "the father of television", is outlined in this memorial Hall. He succeeded in projecting the letter "イ(i)" onto a screen using a casode ray tube image system.



④ Battle Area at Saigagake

One of the battle area regarding the Mikatahara Battle between Takeda Shingen and Tokugawa Ieyasu.



⑤ Goshu Shrine

Goshu Shrine is well kept and visually impressive. Suwa shrine merged with Goshu and the main hall was rebuilt in 1982. Deities attributed to Goshu and Suwa are the God to defend the land and the God of Parenting (babysitting).



⑥ Reconstruction Memorial Museum

Air raid and naval gunfire in World war 2nd burned Hamamatsu to the ground. The museum preserves and displays records of the reconstruction and pictures of people back then.



⑦ Kinoshita Keisuke Memorial Hall

Born and raised in Hamamatsu, Kinoshita Keisuke is widely acknowledged as one of the movie directors who established the golden era of Japanese movies.



⑧ Kamono Mabuchi Memorial Hall

Kamono Mabuchi, born in this area, was a great Japanese classical scholar teaching another famous scholar Motoori Norinaga. Hall introduces his works.

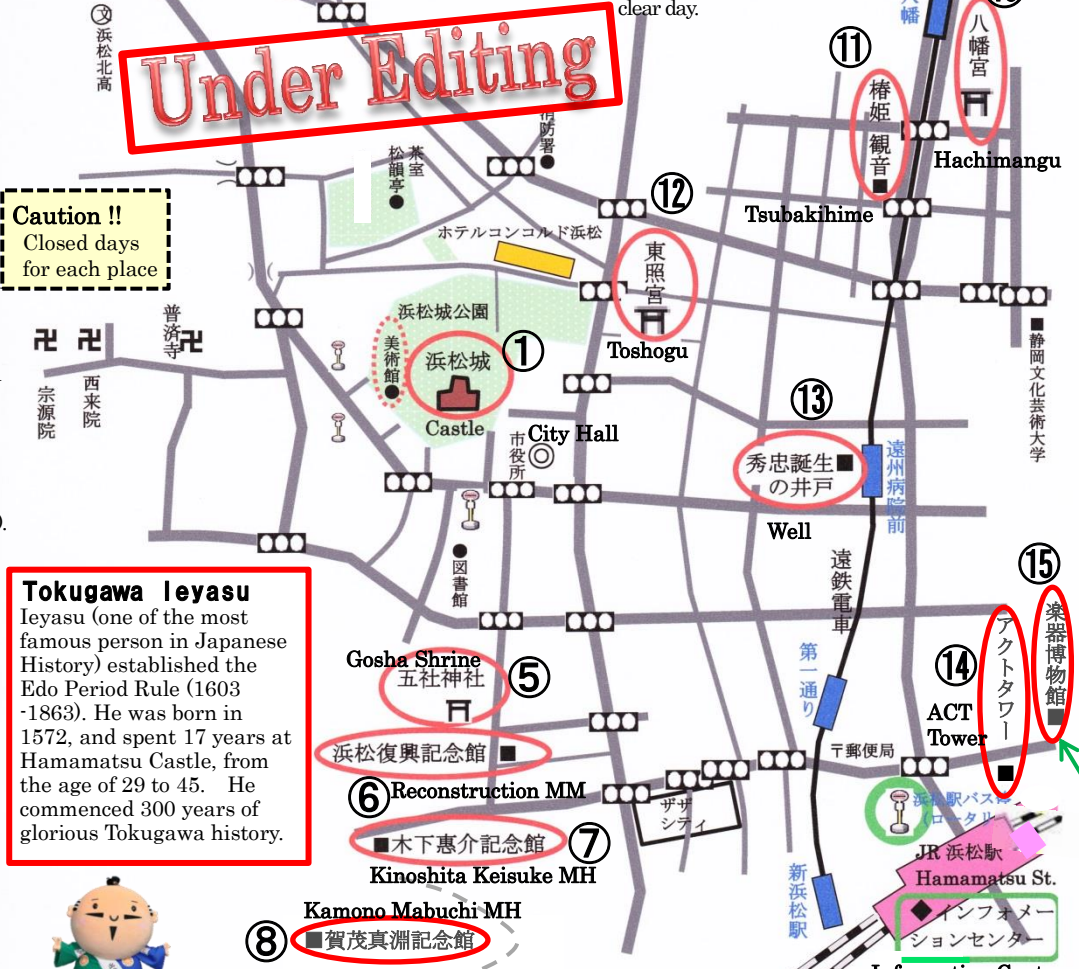
④ 犀ヶ崖 Saigagake

① Hamamatsu Castle

This is called the "Castle of Success", because Tokugawa Ieyasu, the first "Shogun" (General) of the Tokugawa family, lived here for 17 years as a youth, and after then, almost lords of the castle became very superior positions at Edo Period Rule. Mt.Fuji can be seen from the Castle on clear day.

Tokugawa Ieyasu
Ieyasu (one of the most famous person in Japanese History) established the Edo Period Rule (1603 -1863). He was born in 1572, and spent 17 years at Hamamatsu Castle, from the age of 29 to 45. He commenced 300 years of glorious Tokugawa history.

⑨ Nakatajima Sand Dunes

Stretching 4km east to west, Nakatajima Sand Dune is one of Japan's major dunes, with shifting "ripple marks" on a windy day.

⑩ Hachimangu (Shrine)

When losing a battle and running away, Ieyasu hid in hole of canfer tree, and cloud rose to help him to hide from enemy.



⑪ Tsubakihime Kannon

Widow Tazu who became lord of Hikuma castle for her dead husband, is destroyed by Ieyasu. Tsukiyama Gozen (Ieyasu's wife) mourned for death and plants a camellia tree.



⑫ Toshogu Shrine (Hikuma Castle Remain)

This shine dedicated to the memory of Ieyasu. Hideyoshi & Ieyasu visited here. Together, two persons came to the power later. So, it is called as "Power Spot".



⑬ Well for Hidetada's first bathing

When Hidetada (second general of Tokugawa family) was born, this well was used for baby's first bath.



⑭ ACT Tower

The observation deck on the 45th floor of the Act Tower stands 185 meters above the ground and offers one of the best views in this district. Mt.Fuji can be seen on clear day.



⑮ Museum of Musical Instruments

This museum is the only public museum of musical instruments in Japan, maintaining an exhibition of 1,200 musical instruments from the world.



⑯ Hamamatsu Festival Pavilion

The pavilion exhibits kite-making process, kites, and Goten-Yatai (decolation-floats), regarding Hamamatsu Festival..
